How comfortable are you in assessing, interacting with, and treating patients with dementia? Do people with dementia like you? Why or why not? Although this information is tailored at supporting aging adults with a failing brain, you will find the information useful with younger patients, and even with your own relationships. Good oral health for people directly contributes to better quality of life, and good relations and interactions may foster better oral health. This course will present the symptoms of dementia and effective techniques to manage or prevent challenging situations while meeting the needs of your patient. Topics will include how to recognize the stages of the disease, and tips and tools to successfully provide care to those who are simply self-advocating.
